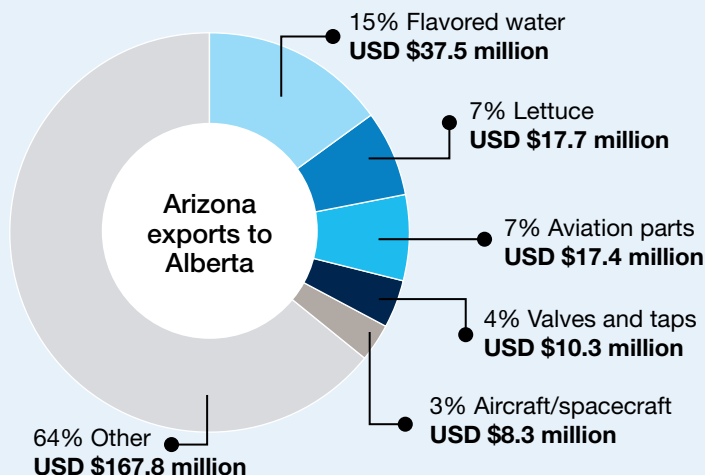

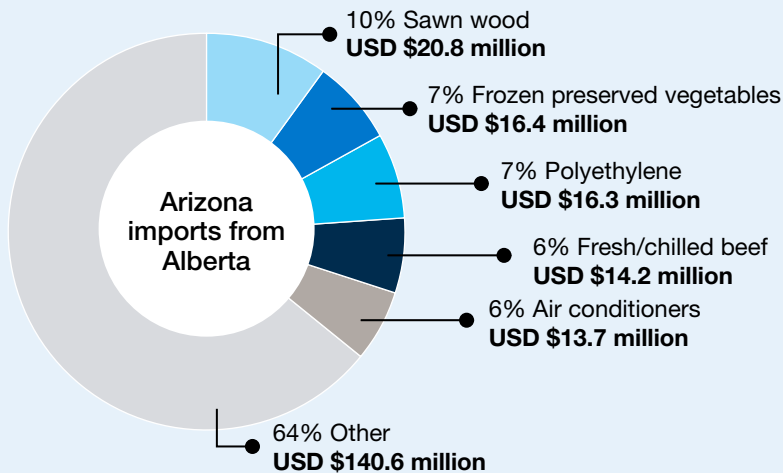
Arizona exports to Alberta totalled **USD \$256 million**

Why Alberta

Alberta and Arizona already share strong economic ties, particularly in the aerospace, technology, agrifood, tourism and infrastructure sectors.

Alberta companies like EPCOR and Stantec provide water and transportation infrastructure, while Arizona-based firms such as Honeywell and RTX operate in Alberta's aerospace supply chain.

Additionally, Edmonton, Alberta-based Capital Power provides affordable electricity to Arizonans through the 1,092 MW Harquahala natural gas-fired power facility.

Mutual trade between our regions is also growing, with Alberta exporting agricultural products, machinery and forestry products to Arizona. Albertans also make up 28 per cent of Arizona's annual visitors arriving on daily, direct flights by Alberta-based WestJet, with many "snowbirds" making Arizona their second home. Collaborative efforts in life sciences research and water security further strengthen our relationship, and this is just the tip of the iceberg.
